Message from Mrs Holmes, Interim Head of School

It is hard to believe we only have one week left of this half term. Over the past two weeks, we have seen our pupil leaders really embracing their leadership roles. This has included our head pupils being involved in showing potential new parents around the school. We are immensely proud of them; it is never easy talking to a large group of adults and confidently answering their questions. This week was also World Mental Health Day and all children had the opportunity to take part and were included in some focused reflection time in classrooms.

Next week, we are really excited to be holding a Talk for Money week across the whole school. This will be delivered using resources from Lifesavers – a financial education programme and Just Finance Foundation – a national charity dedicated to improving financial education so that every child and family has equal opportunity to thrive. The programme focuses on five big questions: Where does our money come from? How does money make us feel? What can we use our money for? How does our money help other people? How can we look after our money? Each class will be focusing on one area. In our next newsletter, we will share some of the amazing learning that happens over the week.

As this is our last newsletter before half term. I would like to confirm that we finish at 3.15pm on Friday 20th October and we come back to school on Monday 30th October. When we come back, we have parent consultation meetings on Tuesday and Wednesday evening. We have received an increase in emails for reporting absences. We cannot guarantee the emails will be checked prior to the children starting at 8:55am.

Therefore, please could we ask you to call the absence line before 8.45am if your child/ren is too unwell for school or will be late due to an appointment. There is an answerphone so a message can be left at any time. Please call each day of absence.

If your child has vomited or has diarrhoea, they must be kept off school for 48 hours from the last episode.


Special Event: Careers Project Launch (4 and 5 January 2024), followed by visitor presentations over the Spring 1 Half Term


Special Event: Global Citizenship Week (15-19 July 2024)

Policy on Charging and Remissions for Academy Activities

The Charging and Remissions Policy sets out what charges can and cannot be made for activities in academies in the Diocese of Norwich St. Benet's Multi Academy Trust. The policy has been drawn up in accordance with Sections 449-462 of The Education Act 1996 which sets out the law regarding what charges can and cannot be made for activities in schools maintained by local authorities. This also applies to the Academy Trust as set out in the Funding Agreement with the Secretary of State.

The policy includes a section detailing the actions to be taken for owed money and debt recovery.
