As there were two vacancies and two nominations, it was not necessary to hold an election.


We look forward to working with Jackie and Ekaette to help deliver our School Vision.




Year 4 - Pocock Class

Religion and Worldviews/PSHE and RSE

At Little Plumstead C or E Primary Academy we aim to ensure that through our comprehensive RE and PSHE curriculums the children will leave Little Plumstead Primary school able to make healthy informed decisions about their own lives and begin to understand where they fit in an ever-changing world. We also ensure that the children are able to have informed conversations about what they believe and that they understand they need to treat the views and opinions of others with respect.

Religion and Worldviews Religion and Worldviews (Religious Education) is an important part of the curriculum at Little Plumstead C of E Primary Academy and is taught using the Norfolk Agreed Syllabus. It brings together learning from a host of subjects and allows children time to apply these skills in a philosophical environment. Religion and Worldviews (RE) plays a significant role in the promotion of spiritual, moral, social and cultural development within the school. Children develop their knowledge and understanding of how religions and worldviews have grown and become established in our world and are able to have informed conversations about their own developing view and the views of others. Each unit of work is looked at through one of three different lenses – theology, human and social sciences and philosophy and is taught using the enquiry process – Engage, Enquire and Explore, Evaluate and Express.

Relationships Education, Sex Education and Health Education (RSHE)

By putting our vision at the heart of our RSHE curriculum, the children are able to build the strong relationships needed to be successful in life. The Jigsaw programme, used throughout the school, holds children at its' heart. The cohesive vision of Jigsaw helps children understand, and value, how they fit into and contribute to the world. Jigsaw has a strong emphasis on emotional literacy, building resilience and nurturing mental and physical health and these. Our school vision inspires us to nurture all children and our RSHE curriculum gives them the skills they need to confidently make their own way in the world. The school's responsibility to safeguard pupils through a curriculum that prepares them to live safely in the modern world remains central to curriculum content, teaching methodologies and supporting resources.

The Jigsaw curriculum revisit the 'Puzzles' taught each year which allows them to build on their previous learning. At Little Plumstead C of E Primary Academy, we actively celebrate the diversity of our pupils, their families and the wider school community. RSHE is always taught in a non-judgmental, non-biased and fully inclusive manner through clear, impartial, scientific information as well as covering the law. We continually recognise and respect pupils' different abilities, levels of maturity and personal circumstances including gender identity, faith or culture and that of their family, friends and the wider whole school community.

We will shortly be sending home our RSE Policy and a letter outlining our RSE curriculum. Plus we will be holding an RSE workshop for parents at the start of the summer term.

Please only send your children in with water in their water bottles. Juice/squash is not allowed.






Quiz and Chips
